Monday, October 26, 2026

The election will take place in person with paper ballots supported by the use of optical scan vote tabulators.

Voters need to have:

- Proof of citizenship

Thursday, October 1, 2026

First Advance Voting Day, from 10:00 AM to 8:00 PM.
Comber Community Centre, 7000 Community Centre St., Comber.

Saturday, October 10, 2026

Second Advance Voting Day, from 10:00 AM to 8:00 PM. Atlas Tube Recreation Centre, 447 Renaud Line, Lakeshore.

Monday, October 26, 2026

Election Day, from 10:00 AM to 8:00 PM.
Your assigned polling location will be listed on your Voter Information Card.

Sunday, November 15, 2026

New term of office commences.

Are you on the Voters' List?

To vote in the 2026 Municipal Election, you must be on the **Voters' List**.

If you are on the list, the Municipality will mail your **Voter Information Card** in September and will include advance voting dates and assigned voting location. If you don't receive a Voter Information Card, please check if you're on the voters' list online at [RegistertoVoteOntario.ca](https://registertovoteontario.ca) or contact the elections team at Elections@Lakeshore.ca.

To register to vote please visit **Lakeshore Town Hall** during regular business hours. **Monday to Friday, 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM**

Getting Back to School Safely

Cross with care: Follow crossing guard directions, use designated crossings, and make eye contact with drivers before stepping into the road.

Stay alert: Put phones and other devices away while walking, cycling, or crossing the street.
