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Help Respect and Protect our Parks this Summer

As summer continues and more residents and visitors head outdoors to enjoy Lakeshore's parks, waterfront, and green spaces, we're asking everyone to help protect these shared community assets.

With an increase in prohibited activities in parks, Lakeshore would like to remind the public that provincial laws and local by-laws prohibit smoking, the use of motorized vehicles (including electric bikes and scooters),

parking outside designated areas, as well as the lighting of fires and barbeques.

You can help ensure these community spaces remain clean, safe, and enjoyable all season by disposing of waste properly, respecting park amenities, and leaving spaces as you found them.

By-law Officers will be conducting regular patrols throughout the summer. To

The election will take place in-person with paper ballots, supported by the use of optical scan vote tabulators.

On Voting Day, Lakeshore Voters will elect the following offices:

- One (1) Mayor
- One (1) Deputy Mayor
- Six (6) Councillors (by ward)
- School Board Trustees (1 each)

New Online By-law Portal

Lakeshore has launched a new online by-law complaint portal to make it easier and more convenient for residents to submit and track by-law concerns. The new portal allows residents to send requests from a home computer or mobile device.

When submitting a complaint, residents are encouraged to provide as much detail as possible, including the location of the concern and a clear description of the issue. Complete and accurate information helps staff review submissions more efficiently and supports timely investigation and follow-up.

Grants for Local Businesses

Lakeshore businesses may be eligible for grants and rebates through the Rural Economic Development Community Improvement Plan (RED CIP). Funding incentives range from \$1,300 to \$16,500 to support improvements that strengthen local businesses, revitalize main streets, and support rural economic development.
