Anzac Community School Playground Replacement

The RMWB is replacing the playground at the Anzac Community School between August and Fall 2026. The new playground will have updated equipment and improvements for students and the community.

Project scope

- Remove the existing playground equipment and surfacing
- Install new playground equipment, surfacing and site features
- Improve drainage in the playground area



What can residents expect

- Increased construction activity within the school grounds
- Temporary closure of the playground during construction
- Construction noise, dust, and equipment in the area
- Construction vehicles and deliveries near the site

RURAL WATER & SEWER SERVICING RESIDENTIAL CONNECTION PROGRAM

Summer construction season is underway! Applications are still being accepted for program activities for the 2026 connection season.

The Rural Water and Sewer Servicing (RWSS) connection program provides piped water and sewer services to properties in Anzac, Conklin, Gregoire Lake Estates, Janvier and Sapræ Creek Estates. This includes residential, small commercial, light industrial, institutional and vacant properties.

Steps to Connect

1. APPLY

Download the application package at rmwb.ca/rwss and submit completed forms to rwss@rmwb.ca. Application packages are also available at rural contact offices. You may authorize a certified contractor to apply on your behalf.

2. ELIGIBILITY REVIEW

Once your application is received, it will be reviewed by the RWSS Team to confirm property ownership (on title) and that all RMWB tax and utility accounts are in good standing.

3. CHOOSE A CONTRACTOR

Select a certified installer from the Alberta Municipal Affairs Private Sewage System Installer Certification List. Request a quote and discuss the scope of work.

Construction Notice:

Anzac Walking Path Expansion and Enhancement

The Anzac Walking Path Expansion and Enhancement project will improve local walking paths with new asphalt trails, benches, garbage and recycling bins, drainage improvements, culvert upgrades, crosswalk painting and landscaping. Work also includes replacing and installing culverts, adding erosion protection and removing unsuitable soil materials. This will be a new trail system, so there will no longer be a need to walk on the road, reducing public safety concerns.

Proposed start and end date: May 19, 2026- October 30, 2027

Phase 1: Construction along Hopegood Dr., Townsend Dr. and Park Dr. from May 19 - October 30, 2026.



Construction Impacts:

This project will use a temporary Laydown area to facilitate its successful completion. The proposed laydown site is located on municipal land off Highway 881 in front of Stony Mountain Road.

Fort McMurray: Increased Air Traffic

Aug 30, 2026 – Cold Lake, Alta. – National Defence / Canadian Armed Forces

4 Wing Cold Lake, Alberta will conduct military training at Fort McMurray International Airport from 31 August to 4 September 2026.

During this period residents of Fort McMurray and the surrounding areas may notice increased air traffic and military activity. The training will involve CF-18 Hornet fighter aircraft and be supported by civilian patterned military vehicles.

4 Wing and Canadian Forces Base Cold Lake values its relationship with its northern community neighbours and appreciates the continued support of the residents. Every effort will be made to minimize noise impacts and reduce disruptions to the community while ensuring essential training objectives are achieved.

CIP grant opportunities are available for registered non-profits, individuals, teams and groups.

The funding supports programs, projects, services, and events that foster community and social wellbeing, as well as encourage participation in amateur sports. The deadline to apply is Sept. 30 at 4:30 p.m.

- **Community Capital Grant** – Provides funding to registered non-profit organizations to support the enhancement, development, or renovation of public-use facilities within the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo. Applications for this grant are by invitation only.
- **Community Impact Grant** – Provides funding to registered non-profit organizations to deliver programs, projects and events that improve quality of life for residents in the region through two streams; the Community Programs and Projects stream and the Community Events stream. This year, applicants may apply for one, or both.
- **Community Sustaining Grant** – Provides funding to registered non-profit organizations providing strategic services that align with three or more funding priorities set by Council. Applications are by invitation only.

- **Games Legacy Grant** – Provides funding to support development in amateur sport, and residents competing at the provincial, national, or international level.

FAQs

How long is an internship?

Internship length and scheduling are flexible based on the student availability and employer needs. Placements typically are 75-125 hours per semester but can be longer.

What is the wage cost to the employer?

Required compensations for student interns is minimum wage or above. Contact CAREERS to check if you are eligible for funding.

Who covers the cost of WCB for interns?

Students pursuing high school credits may be eligible for coverage under Alberta Education's WCB. Students in non-credit based education paths are included under the employer's WCB or alternate insurance.

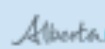
