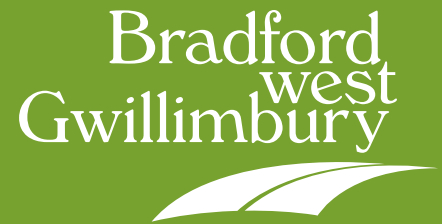


Election Sign By-law Infographic

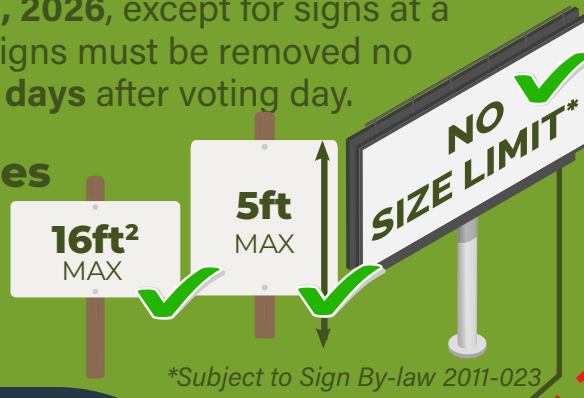
Refer to By-law 2026-027 for a complete list of restrictions.



For the 2026 Municipal Election, signs cannot be displayed prior to **September 8, 2026**, except for signs at a campaign office. All signs must be removed no later than **7 calendar days** after voting day.

Size Allowances

Signs cannot exceed a total of 16ft² or 5ft in height, except for electronic or digital LED billboards.



Campaign Offices

Signs at campaign offices can be displayed upon nomination filing. One sign may exceed 16ft², subject to Sign By-law 2011-23.



Spacing and Location

On residential, commercial, and industrial lots, signs must be no closer than 3ft from a road or 3ft from a sidewalk.

Campaign Vehicles

Candidates may have 1 campaign vehicle displaying up to 2 election signs.

Roadways

Signs cannot be erected on public roads, medians, boulevards, roundabouts or within the sight triangle of an intersection, and must not cause any visual obstructions.

IC&I Properties

Industrial, Commercial, and Institutional properties (like plazas with multiple storefronts) may display 1 election window sign per unit.



Residential, IC&I and Corner Lots

1 election sign is permitted, per candidate, per lot. On corner lots, 1 sign is permitted, per candidate, facing each side of the roadway.

Multi-Residential

Multi-residential buildings can display election signs on windows or balconies.



Town Property

Signs cannot be erected on Town property (parks, roads, municipal buildings) or adhered to utility poles, light poles, utility boxes, trees, planters, benches, waste receptacles, newspaper boxes, or mailboxes.

In all cases, signs cannot be erected without the expressed consent of the owner and/or occupant of the property.
